The Food Trust is seeking energetic and committed individuals for full-time, entry level positions to implement our school-based nutrition education program. This is a unique opportunity to positively impact children's health by providing nutrition education and increased access to nutritious and affordable food in lower income communities. The Food Trust's Nutrition Education Programs are funded by the USDA's Food Stamp Program.

The Project Associate serves as a nutrition educator in approximately 6 public schools throughout Philadelphia. Associates provide nutrition education to schools on a weekly basis on topics such as fruits & vegetables, whole grains and promoting healthy lifestyles.

### **Responsibilities include:**

- Establish and foster relationships with teachers, nurses, principals and school staff
- Provide nutrition education to students and caregivers to improve the overall health of the school community in the form of classroom lessons, school markets, school-wide events, and caregiver workshops
- Train teachers to successfully integrate nutrition education into their classrooms
- Collect documentation from teachers on an ongoing basis for program funding purposes
- Deliver educational materials to schools

**Qualifications:** Bachelors Degree with course work in dietetics and/or nutrition. Ability to handle multiple priorities, organize time effectively, and work independently and as a team player. Strong oral, written and communication skills; bilingual is a plus. Interest in urban education and a desire to work with school-age children, school staff and caregivers. Project Associate positions involve frequent travel throughout the Philadelphia region and require a valid driver's license and access to a reliable vehicle. The ideal candidate will have the following characteristics: a style that promotes collaboration and communication; a high energy level; public speaking skills; a sense of humor; an open mind; a commitment to The Food Trust's mission.
